An ORDINARY MEETING of the CLIMATE & NATURE COMMITTEE was held at the Brockridge Centre, Woodend Road, BS36 2LQ on Wednesday 28th July 2021 at 6.00 pm and was attended by the following:

- CN/2021/1 To receive apologies for absence.
Apologies received from Cllr L. Williams - business and Cllr T.Clark – business.
It was **RESOLVED** to accept the apologies from Cllr T. Clark and Cllr L. Williams.
The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).
- CN/2021/2 To receive members' declarations of interest on any agenda item.
No declarations received.
- CN/2021/3 Appointment of Chair and Vice Chair.
It was **RESOLVED** to appoint David Goodwin as Chair and Julian Selman as Vice Chair.
The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).
- CN/2021/4 Terms of Reference.
Meeting set up was discussed. It was suggested to do one meeting a month on the second Tuesday of each month, alternating in-person committee meetings to approve recommendations and public online meetings to discuss ideas.
Joint consultation response was discussed and involvement of the wider community to be considered within the groups remit.
It was **RESOLVED** to approve the Climate and Nature Committee Terms of Reference.
The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).
- CN/2021/5 Open meeting.
No members of the public present.
- CN/2021/6 Meeting held 5th May 2021.
The meeting notes and recommendations from the 5th May Climate and Nature Working Group meeting were discussed.
It was **RESOLVED** to purchase x2 BBQ signs from Company A at £15 +VAT each in size A4 in colour to be secured on the bench at the Centenary Field. The wording of the signs to include "Please use one

of the metal plates provided on the bench for your disposal BBQ and dispose of waste in the bin once cool. Do not have BBQs anywhere else. Let's keep our local area safe and clean. Thank you”.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was discussed that the committee should consider adding BBQ instructions to the potential new Centenary information board at the entrance of the site.

It was **RESOLVED** to purchase signs for the BBQ area at the park to read “For disposal BBQs and hot coals only. Please do not use for litter’.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

CN/2021/7

Meeting held 20th July 2021.

The Climate and Nature Pre-Discussion meeting notes from 20th July 2021 were discussed. The recommendations from the meeting were reviewed for approval.

It was noted that the meeting notes did not contain a date which shall be added.

It was **RESOLVED** that the Frome Valley Growing Group and Project Officer shall liaise and investigate opportunities to collaborate on seed swapping and information sharing.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to promote the issue of plastic in garden waste through the parish communication channels with Frome Valley Growing Group.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

The recommendation to change the timeline of Centenary Field management to be from 2021 for the next 3 years as agreed within contract and to change Centenary Field pond timeline to include investigations in 2021/22 and installation in 2022/23 was noted before approving the 3-year plan timeline. The addition of the climate and nature policy to the plan was also noted before approving the plan. It was noted that the 3-year project plan was a working document and subject to change.

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the 3-year climate and nature project plan including the timeline and prioritisations and to work towards expanding this list into a detailed Climate and Nature Action Plan for the village.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to plant native hedgerow in front of the fence near Park Row at The Park to help encourage biodiversity.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the Nesting Bird Policy and inspection sheet.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to research and create hedgerow management policy as part of the climate and nature policy, establishing the wildlife friendly way for managing hedges for wildlife and safety.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to not allow weed killer/pesticides at this stage at the car park at the Brockridge Centre, instead to plan a volunteer day to remove weeds by hand with a call for volunteers in the Frome Valley Voice and explain why the Council is avoiding pesticides.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to approve the pesticide policy.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was discussed that the current access at the Centenary Field is sufficient to undertake the new biodiversity management plan.

It was **RESOLVED** that a new access point does not need to be installed at the Centenary Field.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** for the Committee and interested volunteers to assess the corner of the Park by Park Row for conservation potential to consider if enhancement is required through planting native flowers and shrubs.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

Hedge laying was discussed and the option of inviting people who are in training for hedge laying. To be investigated.

It was **RESOLVED** that the Project officer seek costs for planting of hedge infill from current contractor at the Centenary Field and to research the costs and benefits of hedge laying.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

The recommendation was discussed for the Climate and Nature Committee to review the management contract at The Park to investigate where conservation areas, flower, hedges and trees could be established and to seek advice prior to planting on suitable species and crime prevention associated with increased hedge coverage. Stakeholders including nearby residents, sports clubs to be engaged prior to final plan and to consider the impacts on the proposed accessibility pathway. To involve the Woodland Trust / similar organisations for guidance on tree locations and to obtain advice on planting.

It was **RESOLVED** to create a task and finish group involving stakeholders to create the final planting plan for trees, hedges, shrubs and wildflowers at The Park, to include seeking of advice from ecological experts and to include the wider public forum.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

The wording for a COVID memorial tree was discussed and the message to be conveyed, which shall be discussed at a future meeting. It was noted that South Glos Council may provide established free trees as an incentive for developing our Climate and Nature Plan.

It was **RESOLVED** to source 3 quotes to plant a native tree with a plaque in the November planting season at Centenary Field to reflect on the pandemic. Full Council permission to be sought to use the £5000 Community Relief Fund. Wording for the plaque to be decided prior to purchase and to await South Gloucestershire Council response on providing free trees prior to purchase.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

The suggestion to plant a sessile oak tree at the Triangle was discussed. The issues of liability, health and safety and 2m growing height regulations were raised. The triangle was installed to mitigate the dangerous junction and planting a tree could cause visibility issues.

It was **RESOLVED** that no trees will be considered for planting at the triangle for health & safety reasons and following advice from South Glos Council to plant nothing above 2 meters in height.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to work in collaboration with Frampton Scouts to:

- i) plant native mixed trees as part of the Queens Canopy scheme in celebration of the Jubilee.
- ii) to apply for free diverse native trees from the Woodland Trust and Forest of Avon Trust "Trees for Life" grant.
- iii) to give permission for the Scouts to plant a mix of native woodland trees at the Centenary Field to create a connecting woodland, providing a map of the approved tree locations (map).
- iv) A small selection of fruit trees to be planted at the southern edge if they can be sourced.
- v) to instruct the Centenary Field Management contractor to purchase tree spirals and stakes as part of the contract, to be used on the trees planted by the scouts.
- vi) To work with the Centenary Field contractor to provide advice on tree planting.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** for project officer and climate and nature volunteers to contact local businesses and land owners to encourage tree planting, grass growing and raising awareness of improving biodiversity. Volunteers interested in helping with this project to contact Daisy on projectofficer@framptoncoterell-pc.gov.uk.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

It was **RESOLVED** to set up a Climate and Nature group session to form a joint response to South Glos Council's Green Plan Consultation and any other relevant consultations to the committee. To involve the community in an online session in September before the consultations ends.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

The recommendation to create a task and finish group for investigating the issue of sewage in the river Frome was considered. It was discussed that the Frome forum may be able to lead on a response instead.

It was **RESOLVED** that Cllr D. Hockey shall investigate if the Frome forum have already acted on the sewage issue and report back to the committee.

The resolution was correctly proposed and seconded (unanimous).

CN/2021/8 Date of Next Meeting.

A public pre-committee discussion meeting to discuss green infrastructure consultation and any other relevant consultations from South Glos Council shall be held on 7th September at 6pm online.

The next committee meeting shall be held on 14th September at 6pm at The Pavilion Meeting Room, School Road, BS362DA.

The group suggested that meetings are to be held on Tuesdays on the second week of every month, alternating between online discussion only meetings and in person committee meetings. Meetings shall be held at 6pm, subject to absent councillors' availability.

Discussion meeting with Festival Representative
1st September 2021 Online Zoom Meeting 6pm-6:30pm
Meeting notes

Cllrs Present: J. Selman, P.Hockey, D.Hockey & D.Goodwin (Chair).

Officers Present: Daisy Finniear.

Members of the public present: Frampton Festival Rep.

Meeting start: 6pm.

1. Discussion of September meadow cut and June Festival cut at Centenary Field

Cllr D. Goodwin explained the grass cutting rotational September layout plan (Figure 1).

It was noted by the festival representative that the lantern and firework launch area did not need to be cut each year. However, the area would be subject to footfall from festival attendees. It was confirmed that the festival can encourage attendees to walk on the footpaths.




Figure 2: rotational June/July Festival cut

Stall holders need to be in the picnic area. The circus can be slightly away as holding their own sessions; therefore the rotational June layout (figure 2) would be appropriate.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Centenary Field is mown in September on a rotational basis as per the map in figure 1.

RECOMMENDATION: that the Centenary Field is mown if required for the festival in June on a rotational basis as per the map in figure 1.

2. Location for wildflower meadows at Centenary Field.

Wildflower meadows are to be created in the Centenary Field as per the grassland management plan.

The Festival Representative noted that they may require extra fencing to protect wildflower zones, same if pond is added. The first wildflower area should be planted on the east side of the field near Drews Yard (figure 1).

RECOMMENDATION: As per the grassland management plan, plant a wildflower meadow in manageable section on the east side of the field.

3. Discussion of location of scouts' tree planting

The small hay meadow to the west of the field is used for equipment and security by the festival. To avoid vehicles driving through the centre of the field, vehicles are directed through this west hay meadow section.

A gap to accommodate vehicles could be considered and left unplanted with trees.

CLlr Selman raised that the committee should avoid compromising the new woodland and solutions that are safe and secure, both at The Park or Centenary Field, should continue to be investigated before finalising the woodland layout.

The festival representative stated that they are in support of tree planting but would like to find a way to accommodate new trees and festival vehicles.

ACTION: to discuss the tree layout plan at the climate and nature committee to decide the layout of the scouts woodland.

4. Any other business

It was raised that fireworks could cause harm to wildlife. The Festival Rep agreed to remind firework suppliers to get quiet eco-friendly fireworks.

ACTION: Frampton Festival to investigate silent firework display or laser display and report back to the Climate and Nature Committee.

The issue of the Mill Lane wall was raised. South Glos Council offered to undertake a services report free of charge, but this must be followed up. This would include a trial pit and design for making the entrance safe and design a route/gateway with sufficient turning circle.

Daisy raised that Clerk to Council is arranging a Dry Stone Wall Working group to fix walls around the Parish as the high cost to fix the walls not owned by the Parish Council was not an option.

ACTION: Daisy to contact South Glos Council to seek an update on the previous offer to create design reports for Mill lane wall and entrance.

Climate and Nature Pre-Discussion Meeting Online (Zoom) Meeting Notes

1. Apologies

L.Williams, D.Hockey, P.Hockey, T.Clark.

2. Public Open session

A member of the public raised that Frampton Festival seek to know the Terms of Conditions for applications for nature reserve status. It was also requested that Full Council are told the reasons for the Festival not taking place at The Park.

ACTION: Frampton Festival representative to send Daisy revised response to Council regarding Frampton Festivals stance on Festival location. Daisy to share with Full Council.

ACTION: Once further information is obtained regarding the Local Nature Reserve status of the Centenary Field, the Frampton Festival is to be communicated with.

The Mammal Societies citizen science Harvest Mouse Survey programme was raised, which is taking part from Autumn 2021. The information recorded from these surveys could help in the development of Frampton Cotterell's species list. Daisy to seek confirmation from the Mammal Society that the findings can be made available to the committee.

RECOMMENDATION: to share information and encourage residents to take part in the Mammal Trust's Harvest Mouse Survey.

3. Location for Queen's Jubilee Trees.

As per previous discussions (CN/2021/7xiv) at least one of the mature trees from South Glos Council should be a COVID-19 reflection tree at the Centenary Field.

A member of the public raised that the grassland at Park's Drive should not be planted with trees as it is home to rare species of fungus.

The committee should consider approaching developers to suggest tree planting. It was raised to ensure that developers plant trees in addition to their existing quota, and not instead of.

Recommendation to consult the wider community on where they would like to see more trees planted via an Online survey with hard copies available on request.

4. South Glos Council Green Infrastructure Strategy Response

Participants were encouraged to fill out the consultation as individuals prior to helping to form a joint response as a committee.

The consultation was filled out as draft by attendees of the meeting. Further comment to be sought from wider Climate and Nature Committee before submitting.

RECCOMENDATION: to ratify the climate and nature committees' response to South Glos Council's Greener Infrastructure Strategy Consultation.
