**MINUTES OF A REMOTE EXTRA ORDINARY MEETING OF YOUTH SERVICES COMMITTEE HELD 11th FEBRUARY 2021 AT 7.00pm**

There were no apologies.

- YS.20.40**      **To approve the Minutes of the Youth Services Committee meeting held on 30th November 2020**  
It was RESOLVED to approve the Minutes of the Youth Services Committee meeting held on 30th November 2020 as a true and accurate record.
- YS.20.41**      **To receive the Chairman's report**  
The Chairman welcomed the representatives from FACE to the meeting. He reported on the resignation of Cllr P Crocker from the Council and thanked him for his enthusiasm and participation in meetings, the Committee wished him well and hoped he would be able to return. The Chair reported that there was now a councillor vacancy on the Committee.

- YS.20.43**      **To receive a verbal update from FACE on Youth Services**  
FACE gave an update on how the service had been reconfigured as per the guidance to adapt to the latest lockdown. This included:
- Taking part in youth conferences and webinars
  - Christmas window display in the Brockeridge Centre
  - Youth Council run online
  - Youth Club run online
  - One to one support online
  - Detached work every Tuesday
  - Street Doctors training developing skills for young people
  - Young people care packages
  - Working with Winterbourne Academy
  - Working with local police team
  - Developing relationships with young people
  - Ideas on future service provision and projects
- There followed a discussion on:
- The pandemic impact on current and future service provision and opportunities

- the challenges facing young people,
- developing wider partnership working and opportunities including South Gloucestershire Council and neighbouring parish and town councils,
- funding opportunities from partnership and alignment with South Gloucestershire Council
- learning from best practice of other councils
- developing a robust evidence base
- future use of the Pavilion and working with other youth organisations

**YS.20.44 To receive a funding proposal from FACE and the Frampton Youth Council and agree actions**

D Young gave a presentation from the Youth Council showing the development of their design of a uniform of hoodies and t-shirts with a new brand logo plus a breakdown of costs. There followed a question and answer session.

It was RESOLVED to fund the hoodies and t-shirts and that any underspend from the £1000 budget be carried forward to 2021/22 for youth services.

The Committee thanked the Youth Council for their uniform design proposals, the Christmas window display, and all their hard work and RESOLVED to write a letter of thanks to them.

The Chair thanked D Young, FACE, for attending the meeting and answering queries.

It was RESOLVED to agree to exclude the public and the Press.

**YS.20.46 To discuss the Youth Services contract for 2021/22 and agree actions.**

There was a discussion on South Gloucestershire Council contracts and the partnership timescales and funding opportunities with the local providers and the Parish Council, and the proposed contract extension due to the pandemic affecting market competition and viability. The current contract and proposals were reviewed, and it was felt that FACE had done very well especially during the challenges of providing youth services during the pandemic.

It was RESOLVED to recommend to Full Council that due to the impact of the ongoing pandemic:

- a) Accept the proposals from FACE and award the contract for 2021/22 to FACE.
- b) In the event of South Gloucestershire Council extending their youth offering by two years then, depending on performance and outcomes by FACE in 2021/22, that the Parish Council contract to FACE is extended by two years to be in alignment with South Gloucestershire Council youth service contracts.
- c) To discuss with South Gloucestershire Council and Yate Town Council the development of a model contract and bring back to the Youth Committee in time for a new contract to be drawn up by September 2021.
