	The Youth Council advised that they had co-hosted the youth awards event, planned the theme and the food. It celebrated a variety of awards not just formal awards such as the Duke of Edinburgh, the cooking project etc, 80 young people had attended the event. The Committee congratulated the Youth Council for the awards they achieved and for organising the event.	
<b>YS.20.107</b>	<b>SCOUTS REPORT</b>	
	The Scouts representative outlined the report provided and provided a brief summary of the Scouts service provided 1 <sup>st</sup> Frampton run a Squirrels. Beavers, Cubs and Scout Section, 2 <sup>nd</sup> Frampton do not provide all these yet. There is a waiting list of 145 young people of which only 18 are too young to join yet. The Scout groups are struggling to provide the service that the young people want and have difficulty recruiting the leaders. He advised they should be using Mafeking from the summer. There are a variety of awards that the young people can achieve, such as Acorn, Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum as well as the Duke of Edinburgh. IT WAS RESOLVED to note the report.
