

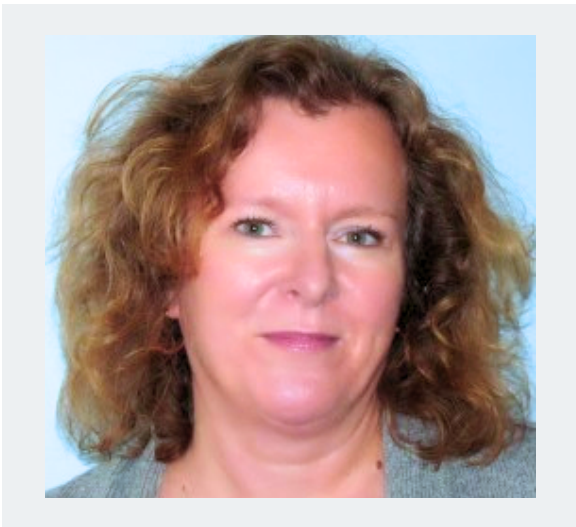

Message From The Chair (continued)

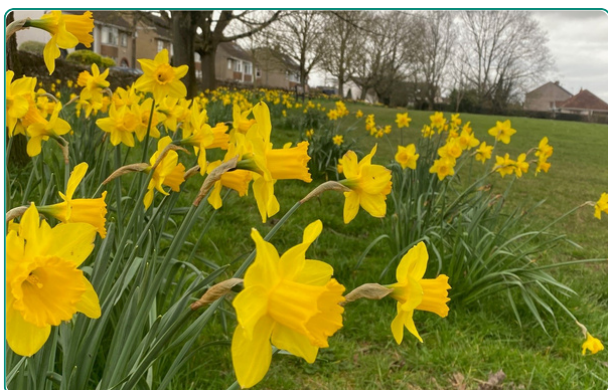

On Thursday the 15th of February, 2024, Frampton Cotterell Parish Council hosted our official opening event for the newly refurbished Ridings Road Play Area.

Thankfully the rain held off, and we even had a spot of sunshine! Our morning's events included a refreshments stand, planting activities, and an official ribbon-cutting ceremony with the parish council Chair.

We would like to thank the local Beavers group who joined us at this event and were fantastic at helping us plant bulbs, trees, plants and hedgerows at the play area. With the help of the Beavers, their families, and other volunteers who chipped in, we were able to do loads of planting in just a few hours!

This planting at Ridings Road coincides with the council's wider planting scheme for the area. We hope that the native-mix hedgerow used will provide shelter and habitats for local wildlife, whilst helping to keep children (and footballs!) safely within the boundaries of the play area. The Beavers also helped with our ceremonial ribbon-cutting. Thank you Beavers!

Tennis Courts Update

In November 2023, work started on our project to refurbish the tennis courts at The Park, School Road, in Frampton Cotterell.

Work has been progressing smoothly since then, and we are pleased to give you a positive update! The tennis courts have now been excellently resurfaced, and we have installed new secure fencing and a secure entry system with remote locking and access.

However, you may notice from our photos that the court lines have yet to be added. When we are able, the court lines will be painted to Lawn Tennis Association Standards.

The paint required for tennis court lines needs an extended period of dry and warm weather in order to dry correctly and adhere to the tennis court surface.

The tennis courts will remain closed until all work has been completed. We look forward to their official opening later this year!

A condition of this funding includes the installation of a fully accessible pathway which links entranceways to courts facilities at The Park.

Precept 2024 / 2025

Welcome to Frampton Cotterell Parish Council's Annual Budget for 2024 / 25. The proposed budget for Frampton Cotterell Parish Council for the financial year 2024 / 2025 is **£414,801**. This is an increase on the previous financial year which had a budget of £381,303.

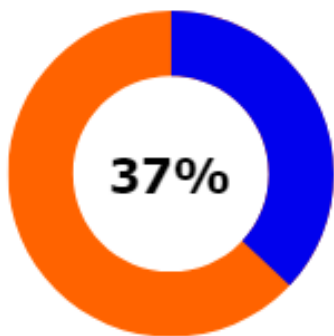
Precept Increase

The parish precept will be increased by 6.79% in 2024 / 25.

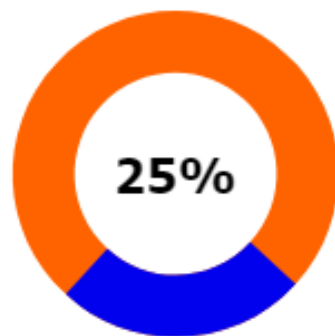
Band D properties will see a precept **increase** of £9.90 for the year, or **82p per month**.

This increase was resolved based on overall increasing costs, the number of projects being carried out, and the loss of certain grant funding monies.

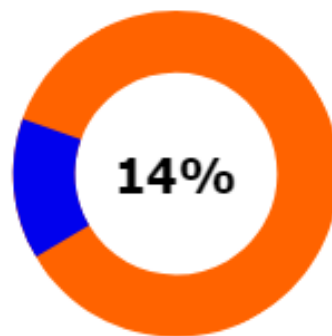
Parish Council Spending 2024 / 2025



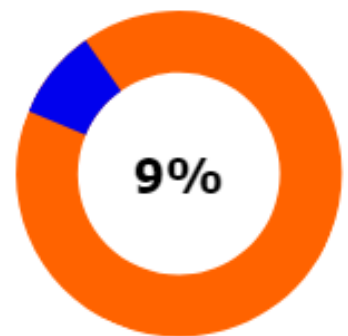

Parish Council Spending 2024 / 2025 (continued)

37% on Support Services.

Costs associated with the general running of the parish council, including support staff, broadband, and materials.

25% on Community Services.

Community events, benches, bins, Christmas lights, Climate & Nature works, and more!

14% on Projects.

Costs for the enhancement and improvement of play areas & open spaces within the parish.

9% on Community Buildings.

Utilities and improvements to Parish Council owned or managed buildings, e.g. the Brockridge Centre and the Pavilion.

7% on Maintenance.

Costs of materials & labour for maintenance, including parks, vehicles, buildings, car parks, etc.

5% on Professional Services.

Professional contracts such as auditing services, health & safety services, legal services & more.

3% on Highway Services.

Costs for emptying litter bins and grass-cutting on all verges within the Frampton Cotterell parish curtilage.

External Funding 2023 / 2024

The parish council secured external funding for projects in 2023 / 2024, including:

- Loaned out free bat detectors.
- Installed a pond at Centenary Field.
- Declared a Climate & Nature Emergency and produced a new Environment Policy.
- Held our Community Awards Nominations and prize-giving (2024 award winners announced soon!).
- Hosted the 2023 Scarecrow Trail, including the public "theme vote", "best scarecrow" vote, and awarding prizes to your winners.
- Ran two Hedgehog Heroes events in collaboration with Frampton Cotterell Nature & Westerleigh Parish Council.
- Hosted the first Local Nature Art Exhibition.

 - £3,950 to Beesmoor Road Playing Field Committee,
 - £2,000 to the Citizen's Advice Bureau,
 - £608 to Frampton Cotterell Male Voice Choir,
 - £400 to FACE youth charity
 - £100 to the Royal British Legion,
- ...and with your help, we raised money for charity, including:
 - £351.75 for Macmillan Cancer Support
 - £264.31 for Bristol Children's Hospital.



Bike Repair Kit

The parish council now has a free to use bike repair kit at the Brockeridge Centre.

The kit, donated by South Glos. Council, contains a tyre pump, puncture repair kits, spare bicycle lights, multi-tools, and tyre levers.



FACE Youth Club

Our FACE Charity youth clubs run every Tuesday and Wednesday evening during term time.

The youth club organises loads of fun activities for young people ages 11 - 18, including seasonal activities. Over Christmas for example, the youth club planned, cooked, and hosted their own Christmas Dinner!
